The statement must be sent by fax (+39 02 55193636) or by e-mail (ledonline@lededizioni.com) complete and duly signed before or together with the papers being submitted for publication.

1. The undersigned author/authors of the above mentioned paper hereby

a) declares/declare that

- the paper is of his/her/their exclusive property and does not contain anything which infringes any third party's copyright or other rights;
- if any of the content of the paper is copyrighted to a third party, copy of the written permission from such other party granting LED the right to use the material in both print and online formats is submitted along with this statement (n. _____ attachments)
- the paper is submitted in final form (see paragraph 7 below);

b) authorizes/authorize LED to publish the paper

- in print form under the "LED Edizioni Universitarie di Lettere Economia Diritto" trademark;
- on-line in the LED electronic archive at http://www.ledonline.it, in non-printable PDF format;
- after revision and correction of the drafts to be performed exclusively by the editors of the volume / journal.

c) agrees and accepts/agree and accept the following paragraphs 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7.

2. On-line publication is an additional service to the publication in print and does not imply any additional cost. LED disclaims any liability for the possible improper use of the texts by users of the web site or by third parties.

3. The publication, both in print and on-line, does not imply any transfer of copyright by the Authors/Editors to the Publisher: the Authors/Editors simply authorise the publication as described in this document. The copyright of the content is maintained wholly by the respective authors/editors, while the editorial format and the graphical layout of the texts published in print and/or on-line by LED remain the exclusive property of LED.

4. The author/authors may publish their texts at any time and in any form with another publisher, with the following limitations:

- the new publication must not reproduce the graphical layout of the publication which appears under the LED trademark, nor use or reproduce the PDF files published on the www.ledonline.it website;
- in the new publication, the preliminary page must cite the references of the previous publication under the LED trademark, including the URL of the on-line publication;
- the new publication must not exclude nor limit the publication, distribution or commercial use of the text, hard copy or digital, by LED in any way. External links must point to the home page of each book or Journal and not directly to pdf files.

5. LED shall have the right to publish, reproduce, distribute, display and store the papers worldwide, even in the event that these texts are re-published under another heading and/or with another publisher. To this end, LED has the right to make use of all forms of distribution, formats, media (whether known now or created in the future), and channels in current or future use by LED, including databases which are external to the www.ledonline.it web site.

6. No fee or royalties are due to authors.

7. Authors' guidelines. The text should follow the style guidelines of the Journal/Series. In addition, the following guidelines must also be used.

a) Text organisation

- The hierarchy of headings is very important, as is uniformity and consistency of the segmentation of the text into sections, sub-sections, and paragraphs. Headings must be numbered. Up to three levels of headings may be used. E.g. 1. 1.1. 1.1.1. 1.1.2. 1.2. - 2. 2.1. 2.2. 2.2.1. 2.2.2. ... Further levels and blank lines which are not correlated to titles must not be used.
- There should be uniformity and consistency in the use of bold type, italic and quotation marks. Avoid combined use of these unless it is absolutely necessary. If possible, avoid the use of bold type and use italic instead. Avoid underlining.
- Punctuation must be consistent, including where it is used in figures and numbering (thousands, decimals, etc...)
- There must be uniformity and consistency in bibliographical references
- Use of capital and small letters. There must be uniformity and consistency in the use of capitalisation for acronyms, institutions, etc... Capital and small letters are to be used for the names of authors. Avoid capitalization. Avoid small capitals
- All typographical errors must be eliminated. It is expected that authors will submit proofread material.
- An abstract and 10 keywords must also be supplied.

b) Figures - Tables

- Photographs, drawings, graphs and graphics are all identified as "FIGURES".
- Figures can be reproduced only if they are free of copyright restrictions, i.e. if they are in the public domain or accompanied by permission from the rights holder. Images downloaded from the Internet always require authorisation unless expressly declared otherwise in the source.
- Authors must identify all figures which require authorisation for publication and provide the permission on submission of the text to be published. No text with copyright permissions pending will be accepted. The sources of figures and tables reproduced from other publications must be cited.
- All elements in Word graphs must be grouped by the "Drawing toolbar".
- Figures and tables should be numbered consecutively using two separate numerical sequences starting from Figure 1 and Table 1. References to figures and tables should always be quoted in the chosen position within the text, in the following format (Fig. 00 - Tab. 00).
- Figures (including graphs) will be reproduced without any additional adjustment, with the same definition and quality as the original. All figures must be suitable for black and white print reproduction; readability in grey scale must be checked and optimized before submission.

d) Submitting files

- It is strongly recommended that authors supply a PDF file generated from the final Word file on the same computer used to complete the work, or a printed copy of the text. This is indispensable when the text contains graphs, graphics, formulas, Greek or special characters or phonetic symbols.
- All fonts different from that used for the basic text must be listed and supplied with the text.
- All figures embedded in a Word file should also be submitted in the original electronic format (300 dpi TIF o .JPG, .EPS, .XLS).
- When graphs are produced in Word, Excel, yED, in order to maintain quality they must be supplied in editable format (not as image).
- Formulas must be supplied in MathType editable format (not as images or objects)
